HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, March 8, 1966.

The committee on State Administration, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 480) of Francis W. Hatch, Jr., and other members of the House for legislation to extend to public authorities the application of the laws pertaining to fair competition for bidders on construction contracts for public works or buildings; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 481) of Francis W. Hatch, Jr., and other members of the House for extending to public authorities the application of certain laws pertaining to public contracts; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 490) of Francis W. Hatch, Jr., and other members of the House for extending to public authorities the requirements of competitive bidding for construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, repair or demolition of public buildings; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 491) of Sidney Q. Curtiss that certain provisions of law relative to bidding be made applicable to public authorities created by the General Court; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 702) of Jack H. Backman that provisions of law relative to bidding be made applicable to public authorities created by the General Court, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 3166).

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO THE AWARDING OF CONTRACTS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND FOR MATERIALS BY COUNTIES, CITIES, TOWNS, AND DISTRICTS IN CASES OF EXTREME EMERGENCY AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

1 *Resolved*, That the special commission, established by chap-
2 ter eighty-eight of the resolves of nineteen hundred and sixty-
3 five and revived and continued by chapter one of the resolves
4 of nineteen hundred and sixty-six, shall, in the course of its
5 investigation and study, consider the subject matter of current
6 house document numbered 480, extending to public authorities
7 the application of law pertaining to fair competition for bidders
8 on construction contracts; 481, extending the application of
9 certain provisions pertaining to public contracts to public au-
10 thorities; 490, extending the requirements of competitive bid-
11 ding for construction, reconstruction, alteration, remodeling, re-
12 pair or demolition of public buildings to public authorities; 491,
13 requiring authorities created by the legislature to comply with
14 certain provisions of law designed to protect the public interest
15 which are applicable to public agencies; and 702, requiring au-
16 thorities created by the legislature to comply with certain pro-
17 visions of law designed to protect the public interest which are
18 applicable to public agencies.
