AN ACT TO PERMIT SUSPENSION OF EXECUTION OF SENTENCE TO FINE AND IMPRISONMENT, EXCEPT FOR CRIMES PUNISHABLE BY LIFE IMPRISONMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 1A of chapter 279 of the General Laws, as most
- 2 recently amended by section 2 of chapter 205 of the acts
- 3 of 1934, is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence
- 4 and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:—
- 5 The provisions of this section shall not permit the suspen-
- 6 sion of the execution of the sentence of a person convicted of
- 7 a crime punishable by imprisonment for life.
