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AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF DUKES COUNTY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM ESTABLISHED IN SAID COUNTY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The county commissioners of the county of Dukes County
- 2 are hereby authorized to participate in establishing and main-
- 3 taining public health services provided by the department of
- 4 public health in said county, and to expend for such purpose
- 5 such sums, not exceeding five thousand dollars, as may be in-
- 6 cluded in appropriation acts for said county.
