*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives:*

In accordance with the provisions of Article LVI of the Amendments of the Constitution, I am returning, herewith, Senate Bill No. 288 entitled "An act providing that if a license for the sale of alcoholic beverages issued to a person licensed to conduct a restaurant is exercised at more than one location in an airport, stadium or auditorium, additional fees may be established therefor."

I believe that the present wording of the bill is too broad in that a literal reading of the statute would indicate that the license could be exercised at any place within the confines of an airport. I believe that the petitioners of the bill intended that the license would only extend to another location or stand in the particular building.

I, therefore, recommend the bill be amended as follows: —

By inserting after the word "stand" in the first sentence the words "in any one building".
