RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE PESTICIDE BOARD RELATING TO THE BONDING OF APPLICATORS OF PESTICIDES.

1 *Resolved*, That the Pesticide Board is hereby authorized and
2 directed to make an investigation and study of the subject
3 matter of current Senate document numbered 414 relative to
4 the bonding of applicators of pesticides to provide for pay-
5 ment of damages resulting from the misapplication of pesti-
6 cides. Said board shall report to the General Court the results
7 of its investigation and study, and its recommendation, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its rec-
9 ommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk
10 of the senate on or before the last Wednesday of December,
11 nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.
