**AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ISSUANCE OF MOTOR BUS PERMITS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 8 of chapter 159A of the General Laws, as most  
2 recently amended by chapter 456 of the acts of 1968, is hereby  
3 further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting  
4 in place thereof the following two sentences: — No motor vehicle  
5 shall be operated under a license issued under the provisions of  
6 this chapter without a permit from the department, except that a  
7 motor vehicle of an interstate carrier being used simultaneously  
8 in both interstate operations and intrastate operations under the  
9 operating authority of a certificated intrastate carrier may be  
10 operated without such permit, provided that such motor vehicle  
11 is equipped to comply with the rules and regulations pro-  
12 mulgated by the department governing the operation of such  
13 vehicle.

14 A carrier operating under a certificate issued under the  
15 provisions of section 7 of this chapter shall certify to the
