

By Mr. Melia of Boston, petition of John F. Melia relative to the salary of the assistant clerk of courts for the county of Middlesex designated to perform the duties of the clerk of said court pertaining to equity proceedings. Counties.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF THE ASSISTANT CLERK OF COURTS FOR THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX DESIGNATED TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE CLERK OF SAID COURT PERTAINING TO EQUITY PROCEEDINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6A of chapter 221 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 3 of chapter 774 of
3 the acts of 1949, is hereby further amended by striking out, in
4 line 10, the word "five" and inserting in place thereof the
5 word: — ten, so as to read as follows: —

6 *Section 6A.* The justices of the superior court may designate,
7 for a term of three years from the date of such designation, one
8 of the assistant clerks for the county of Middlesex, appointed
9 under section four or section five, to perform, under the
10 direction of the clerk of the courts for the county of Middlesex,
11 the duties of clerk pertaining to the equity proceedings in said
12 court, who shall receive from said county, in addition to the
13 salary paid to him as an assistant clerk under section four or
14 section five, as the case may be, a sum equivalent to ten per cent
15 of the salary of the clerk.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January first,
2 nineteen hundred and seventy-three.
