AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 8 of chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out paragraph (a), as most recently amended
3 by section 1 of chapter 758 of the acts of 1968, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 (a) With respect to any period of insurance authorized by this
6 chapter which is in effect for an active employee and dependent
7 or retired employee and dependent, the entire premiums for
8 basic group life insurance, group accidental death and dis-
9 memberment insurance, and group general or blanket insurance,
10 as set forth in section five, shall be paid by the commonwealth;
11 and with respect to any period of additional group life insurance
12 and group accidental death and dismemberment insurance, as
13 provided in section 10A, which is in effect for an active
14 employee, there shall be withheld from each payment of salary
15 or wages of such employee an amount equal to one hundred
16 percent of the premium for such additional or optional in-
17 surance.

4. This information is being presented to the House of Representatives
5. in accordance with the provisions of the resolution mentioned above.
6. The lands included in this report are those lands which are
7. owned by the State of California, and which are being
8. managed by the State Lands Commission. These lands include
9. the lands which were acquired by the State of California
10. from the United States Government, and the lands which
11. were acquired by the State of California from private
12. individuals. The lands which were acquired from the
13. United States Government are those lands which were
14. acquired by the State of California under the provisions
15. of the Act of March 3, 1879, and the Act of March 3,
16. 1891. The lands which were acquired from private
17. individuals are those lands which were acquired by the
18. State of California under the provisions of the Act of
19. March 3, 1879, and the Act of March 3, 1891.
