**AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF DISTRICT ATTORNEYS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 12 of the General laws is hereby amended by striking  
2 out section 15, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter  
3 696 of the acts of 1972, and inserting in place thereof the  
4 following section: —

5 *Section 15.* District attorneys shall receive from the  
6 commonwealth salaries as follows: — for the Suffolk district,  
7 thirty-four thousand dollars and such district attorney shall  
8 devote his entire time during ordinary business hours to his  
9 duties and shall neither directly or indirectly engage in the  
10 practice of law; for the northern district, twenty-three thousand  
11 dollars; for the middle district, twenty thousand dollars; for the  
12 eastern district, twenty thousand dollars; for the Norfolk district,  
13 twenty thousand dollars; for the southern district, twenty  
14 thousand dollars; for the western district, eighteen thousand five  
15 hundred dollars; for the northwestern district, seventeen  
16 thousand dollars; for the Plymouth district, eighteen thousand  
five hundred dollars.
