HOUSE No. 539

By Mr. Navin of Marlborough, petition of the Massachusetts Public Employees Association, Inc., that public employees who have completed thirty years of service and who have reached the age of fifty-five years be authorized to retire at eighty per cent of their highest rate of compensation. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS OF CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
2 to the contrary any member of a contributory retirement
3 system established under the provisions of chapter 32 of the
4 General Laws who has completed at least thirty years of service
5 in the aggregate, and who has reached at least age fifty-five
6 may elect to be retired at eighty percent of his highest annual
7 rate of compensation.
