AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO SELL CERTAIN SUPPLIES AND PROPERTY TO CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 51 of chapter 30 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence: —
- 3 Said bureau may sell to cities and towns any supplies and
- 4 property purchased by the commonwealth.
