

HOUSE No. 566

By Mr. Grosso of Shrewsbury, petition of Anthony P. Grosso relative to extending the time within which certain owners of motor vehicles may apply for an abatement of the motor vehicle excise tax. Taxation.

AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH CERTAIN OWNERS OF MOTOR VEHICLES MAY APPLY FOR AN ABATEMENT OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE EXCISE TAX LEVIED THEREON.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to permit certain owners of motor vehicles to secure such abatement, who were deprived of an opportunity to apply for an abatement of the tax levied thereon because of a delay in processing the bill, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section two of chapter
2 sixty A of the General Laws, any owner of a motor vehicle,
3 who received the bill for the motor vehicle excise tax levied on
4 such vehicle for the year nineteen hundred and seventy-one on
5 or after June first, nineteen hundred and seventy-two, may
6 apply for an abatement of such tax until June thirtieth, nine-
7 teen hundred and seventy-three, and such application shall be
8 as effective for all purposes as if it had been filed within the
9 time required by said section two.
