## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHILDREN OF PRISON OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES WHO ARE KILLED OR DIE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 7E of chapter 69 of the General Laws,  
2 inserted by chapter 712 of the acts of 1966, is hereby amended  
3 by inserting after the word "safety", in line 5, the words: — or  
4 officer or employee of a Massachusetts correctional system.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of section seven E of chapter  
2 sixty-nine of the General Laws, as amended by section one of  
3 this act, shall apply to the children of officers or employees of a  
4 Massachusetts correctional system who were killed or who died  
5 in the performance of duty prior to as well as after the effective  
6 date of this act.
