By Mr. MacLean of Fairhaven, petition of William Q. MacLean, Jr., for legislation to prohibit the use of metal-studded snow tires on public ways between May the first and October the first of each year. Public Safety.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

### AN ACT PROHIBITING THE USE OF METAL-STUDED SNOW TIRES ON PUBLIC WAYS BETWEEN MAY THE FIRST AND OCTOBER THE FIRST.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 16 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out the second paragraph, added by chapter  
3 412 of the acts of 1971, and inserting in place thereof the  
4 following paragraph: —

5 No person shall operate a motor vehicle equipped with  
6 metal-studded snow tires upon a public way between May the  
7 first and October the first. Whoever violates the provisions of this  
8 paragraph shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty  
9 dollars.

Resolved, That the Committee on the Judiciary be and they are authorized to report to the House the following bill:

**THE CONSTITUTIONALITY OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT**

Section 1. The Constitution of the United States is hereby declared to be the supreme law of the land, and the laws of the United States made in pursuance thereof shall be the supreme law of the several States, in all cases where they conflict with the Constitution or the laws of the United States.

Section 2. It is the duty of every citizen of the United States to support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic, and to bear arms and to perform such other duties as may be required by the law of the United States.
