RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF UTILIZING THE KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE OF SENIOR CITIZENS.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two
2 members of the senate, three members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, the secretary of elder affairs or his designee, the
4 secretary of manpower affairs or his designee, and three mem-
5 bers to be appointed by the governor, is hereby established for
6 the purpose of making an investigation and study relative to
7 the feasibility of establishing a program to be known as the
8 Senior Service Corps whereby the knowledge and experience of
9 senior citizens would be utilized in business, government, com-
10 munity affairs and in other fields in which they might con-
11 tribute.
