### AN ACT TO PLACE THE COST OF ADMINISTERING THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT ON THE INSURERS AND SELF-INSURERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 23 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 striking out section 13 thereof and inserting in its place the  
3 following section: —

4 *Section 13.* The department may expend for the traveling  
5 expenses of its members and employees incurred in the per-  
6 formance of their duties and for other necessary expenses of  
7 the department such sums as shall be determined by the  
8 department of administration and finance as necessary to carry  
9 out the provisions of chapter 152. Such sums shall, beginning  
10 January 1, 1974, be assessed against the insurers and self-  
11 insurers, as they are defined in chapter 152, in an equitable and  
12 reasonable manner to be determined by the commissioner of  
13 insurance.
