## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION BENEFITS FROM BEING PAID TO EMPLOYEES DURING A VACATION SHUTDOWN PERIOD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 25 of Chapter 151A is hereby amended by inserting at  
2 the end of paragraph a, the following sentence: — No waiting  
3 period shall be allowed and no benefits shall be paid to any  
4 employee whose unemployment is due to a stoppage of work  
5 which exists because of his employer's closing the factory,  
6 establishment or other premises at which he was last employed,  
7 for a vacation or holiday shutdown period.
