AN ACT CHANGING THE DEFINITION OF PRIZES WHICH MAY BE WON FROM THE GAME OF BEANO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 52 of chapter 147 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the fifth paragraph, as appearing in
3 section 3 of chapter 486 of the acts of 1971, and inserting in
4 place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 A licensee may give prizes which do not exceed fifty dollars,
6 either in cash or merchandise, without limitation as to number
7 and may in addition, in any one day, give not more than three
8 prizes which do not exceed five hundred dollars in value, either
9 in cash or merchandise.

The Constitution of the State of New York

as amended to the 15th of August, 1901.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, AS AMENDED TO THE 15TH OF AUGUST, 1901.

It is enacted by the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York, in session assembled, and by the authority of the people thereof, that the Constitution of the State of New York, as amended to the 15th of August, 1901, be and the same are hereby published.

SECTION 1. The State of New York shall be a free and independent State, free from all external domination, and shall have the right to make peace and war, to contract treaties, alliances and engagements, to send and receive ambassadors and other public ministers, to enter into all forms of international relations, and to maintain a navy and a militia, subject to the provisions of this Constitution.
