AN ACT REQUIRING CERTAIN DEVICES ON MOTOR VEHICLES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 7 of chapter 90 of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting before the last sentence the
3 following sentence: — Every new motor vehicle sold in the
4 commonwealth or elsewhere and registered in the commonwealth
5 after January first, nineteen hundred and seventy-five shall be
6 equipped with a device, which shall be as tamper-proof as
7 possible, that shall produce a warning noise of a sufficient
8 intensity when the motor vehicle exceeds the speed of eighty
9 miles per hour with said device and noise intensity conforming to
10 standards and regulations promulgated by the registrar. The
11 warning device on each such vehicle shall be so equipped that the
12 operator may set the device at a speed less than but not greater
13 than eighty miles per hour.
