AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE METHOD OF APPOINTING A REPRESENTATIVE OF ORGANIZED LABOR ON HOUSING AUTHORITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The sixth paragraph of section 5 of chapter 121B of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of
3 chapter 565 of the acts of 1971, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out the first sentence and inserting in the place thereof
5 the following sentence: — In a city, one of the four members
6 of a housing authority appointed by the mayor shall be a
7 representative of organized labor who shall be appointed by the
8 mayor from a list of five or more names representing different
9 unions submitted by the central labor council, AFL-CIO and
10 the teamsters union, of the city district within which the city
11 is included.
