**AN ACT TO PERMIT SALEM TO ESTABLISH FEES AND REGULATIONS
FOR HAWKERS AND PEDDLERS WITHIN SALEM.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
- 2 the city of Salem may establish regulations relative to the sale
- 3 of goods, wares or merchandise by hawkers or peddlers within
- 4 said city. Said city may also establish fees for the issuance of
- 5 licenses to hawkers and peddlers to sell therein.
