The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT JUSTICES OF THE DISTRICT COURTS BE COMPENSATED FOR SERVICE ON APPELLATE DIVISIONS OF THE DISTRICT COURTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 108 of chapter 231 of the General Laws as most
2 recently amended by chapter 867 of the acts of 1971 is hereby
3 further amended by striking out the second paragraph and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: -

5 A justice acting in the appellate division of a district court
6 shall be allowed in addition to his compensation as set forth in
7 chapter 218 of the General Laws, the sum of two thousand
8 dollars for each year's service, and his necessary traveling
9 expenses, incidental expenses and clerical assistance while so
10 acting, which is to be paid by the Commonwealth. No
11 deductions shall be made from the compensation of a justice
12 acting in the appellate division of a district court under section
13 six of chapter 218 on account of compensation paid to a
14 special justice of his court for service at any session which such
15 justice is unable to hold by reason of so acting.
