AN ACT REMOVING THE MAXIMUM RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE LIMITATION FOR CERTAIN MEMBERS OF LOCAL RETIREMENT SYSTEMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the limitations of para-
2 graph (c) of subdivision (2) of section five of chapter thirty-two
3 of the General Laws, any member of a police force in any city
4 or town who has completed a minimum of forty years of
5 creditable service shall be eligible to receive a retirement
6 allowance in excess of eighty percent, but not to exceed
7 eighty-five percent, of the average annual rate of his regular
8 compensation received during any period of three consecutive
9 years of creditable service for which such rate of compensation
10 was the highest.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
