## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT EXEMPTING FROM THE INCOME TAX ALL MONIES RECEIVED FOR A MILITARY SERVICES CONNECTED DISABILITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 5B of chapter 62 of the General Laws,  
2 as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 557 of the Acts  
3 of 1969, is hereby further amended by adding the following  
4 paragraph: —

5 (7) An exemption equal to the monies received from the  
6 federal government for a military services connected disability.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall apply with respect to taxable  
2 years ending on and after December thirty-first, nineteen  
3 hundred and seventy.
