## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF CERTAIN RECORDS OF THE REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 30 the following section: —
- 3 *Section 30A.* The registrar in making records available to the
- 4 public relative to licenses which have been suspended or
- 5 revoked under the provisions of this chapter, shall not make
- 6 any computer or tabulation system of the registry for listing
- 7 such suspensions and revocations available to any person,
- 8 company or corporation or in any way permit such an ex-
- 9 amination of the registry's records relative to such suspensions
- 10 and revocations as would make it the provider of business
- 11 information for any outside agency, enterprise or company.

## THE COMMITTEE ON INVESTIGATION

ACT RELATIVE TO THE INVESTIGATION OF THE  
ACTIVITIES OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

That the Senate and House of Representatives  
do hereby enact the following provisions:

1. Chapter 17 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 17A the following section:
2. Section 17B. The general investigation conducted by the public relative to the activities of the Senate and House of Representatives under the provisions of this chapter shall not include any computer or electronic system or the rights of access to such computer and electronic systems in the Senate.
3. Any company or organization that is not affiliated with any institution of the Senate or House of Representatives is not authorized to disseminate information to the public.
4. Information for any public officer, employee, or company
