Chap. 116. AN ACT INCREASING CERTAIN LICENSE FEES IN THE TOWN OF BROOKLINE AND AUTHORIZING THE TRANSPORTATION BOARD TO PRESCRIBE THE FEE FOR HACKNEY LICENSES IN SAID TOWN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty-three of chapter one hundred and forty or section two of chapter one hundred of the General Laws or any other general or special law or by-law to the contrary, certain annual license fees required by or in the town of Brookline may be increased to the following amounts: —

Lodging House License Fee: One to nine rooms: twenty-five dollars; ten to nineteen rooms: fifty dollars; more than nineteen rooms: one hundred dollars.

Auctioneer License Fee: Ten dollars.

SECTION 2. The town of Brookline, acting through its transportation board, may, notwithstanding any provision of section twenty-two of chapter forty of the General Laws or any other general or special law or by-law to the contrary, prescribe the fees for hackney licenses in said town.
