AN ACT REGULATING THE RENTS OF ELDERLY PERSONS IN STATE-AIDED PUBLIC HOUSING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 40 of chapter 121A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking paragraph (e) and substituting the
3 following: —

4 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no
5 elderly person of low income shall be required to pay more
6 than fifteen per cent of his or her income without utilities or
7 twenty per cent with utilities for rent for dwelling units in
8 projects or parts of projects constructed or leased or purchased
9 under this chapter. Any deficiency in the budget of a housing
10 authority caused by such reduced rental shall be reimbursed by
11 the Commonwealth and paid to the housing authority in an
12 amount equal to the difference between the tenant's rent and
13 the prorated cost of operating that unit. The prorated cost of
14 operations shall be computed on the basis of the operating
15 budget of the housing authority as approved by the department
16 with provision for a full operating reserve.
