AN ACT DECREASING THE LICENSING FEES PAID BY MOBILE HOME OWNERS AGED SIXTY-FIVE OR OVER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 32G of chapter 140 of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first
3 sentence, as most recently amended by chapter 470 of the acts
4 of 1971, and inserting in place thereof the following sen-
5 tence: — In addition to the license fee provided for under
6 section thirty-two B, each mobile home park owner or operator
7 licensed under said section shall, except as hereinafter provided,
8 pay an additional license fee of six dollars per month or major
9 fraction thereof, on account of each mobile home, occupying
10 space within such mobile home park; provided, however, that
11 said mobile park owner or operator shall pay only an
12 additional fifty cents per month or major fraction thereof, on
13 account of each mobile home owned by a person sixty-five
14 years of age or older, occupying space within such mobile
15 home park, and provided that in a city by vote of the city
16 council and in a town by vote of the board of selectmen the
17 amount of such additional license fee may be increased to an
18 amount not exceeding twelve dollars per month on account of
19 each mobile home occupying space within such mobile home
20 park, not exceeding one dollar per month on account of each
21 mobile home owned by a person sixty-five years of age or
22 older, occupying space within such mobile home park.
