

and the estimated value of each such asset, (e) a statement that the affiant has undertaken to act as voluntary administrator of the estate of the deceased and will administer the same according to law, and apply the proceeds thereof in conformity with this section and (f) the names and addresses of surviving joint owners of property with the deceased, known to the affiant. The oath required by this section shall not be governed by section one A of chapter two hundred and sixty-eight.

Chap. 264. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY TO ACT AS AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REGIONAL COMMISSION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 425 of the acts of 1963, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 1191 of the acts of 1973, is hereby further amended by adding the following three paragraphs: —

Said county commissioners may agree to act as and assume the duties, obligations, and responsibilities of an economic development regional commission for the towns in Franklin county, subject to the availability of funds for such purpose; provided, however, that said towns shall be eligible for designation as an economic development region in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965.

If said commissioners vote to act as and assume the duties, obligations, and responsibilities of an economic development regional commission, said county commissioners may designate the Franklin county planning board to serve as the economic development regional commission, and may appoint such technical and advisory committees as are necessary and required by the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965, in accordance with the provisions of said act, for the purpose of providing advice and guidance.

Said county commissioners may prepare, adopt and amend economic development programs which shall be public records. Said commissioners may conduct feasibility and implementation studies for public facilities and programs and develop public and private development projects which are consistent with and which aid in implementing the objectives of said commission. Said county commissioners may expend such sums as may be appropriated therefor in the county budget to implement its plans and recommendations for the economic and industrial development of the region and may sponsor conferences, institutes, seminars and training programs on behalf of the region.
