**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE STATE TREASURER DEPOSIT A PROPORTIONATE AMOUNT OF PUBLIC MONIES IN BLACK-CONTROLLED BANKS REPRESENTING THE SHARE OF STATE REVENUE PAID BY BLACK CITIZENS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 34 of chapter 29 of the General Laws is hereby  
 2 amended by adding the following paragraph: —  
 3 The state treasurer shall determine the proportion of state  
 4 revenue which he believes is paid by black residents of the  
 5 commonwealth and shall deposit that proportionate share of  
 6 the public monies in his possession in such national banks, or  
 7 trust companies, or banking companies, lawfully doing business  
 8 in the commonwealth, where a majority of the board of direc-  
 9 tors of such national banks, or trust companies or banking  
 10 companies are black citizens. The provisions of this section  
 11 governing deposit limits may be suspended if the state treasurer  
 12 finds that there are not a sufficient number of black-controlled  
 13 banks to deposit said proportionate share within the deposit  
 14 limits. The provisions of this section regarding black-controlled  
 15 banks shall also apply to banks in which the state treasurer  
 16 may deposit public monies as authorized by section thirty-four

17 A of chapter twenty-nine if a majority of the boards of  
 18 directors of such banks are black citizens. For the purposes of  
 19 this section, revenue from the state lottery shall be treated as  
 20 state revenue.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE TREASURER SHALL PAY TO THE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THIS 15TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1973, THAT THE STATE TREASURER SHALL PAY TO THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY THE STATE LOTTERY REVENUE IN FULL FOR THE STATE LOTTERY REVENUE ACCOUNTING THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI PAID BY BLACK CITIZENS.
