The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATIONS FOR CABLE TELEVISION PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Community development corporations may be established for
2 cable television purposes as non-profit corporations under the
3 corporation laws of the commonwealth or as public instru-
4 mentalities. Such community development corporations, or the
5 cities and towns in which they are located, may issue bonds and
6 notes to finance community-controlled cable television facilities.
7 The community development corporations may also enter into
8 cooperative arrangements with other parties to facilitate the
9 financing and operation of the facilities, including contracts for
10 management services.

The bill is hereby passed by the House of Representatives, this 1st day of June, 1904.

The Committee of Revision
