**AN ACT PROVIDING FOR REGULATING DEVICES FOR THE LIMITATION OF SPEED ON ALL NEW VEHICLES SOLD IN THE COMMONWEALTH.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 7 of chapter 90  
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting before the  
3 last sentence the following four sentences: —

4 Every new motor vehicle sold, offered for sale, leased, rented  
5 or registered in the commonwealth shall be equipped with a  
6 regulatory device or governor which will restrict the speed of  
7 such vehicles to seventy-five miles per hour. The regulatory  
8 device or governor shall be constructed so as to be as tamper  
9 proof as possible so that only authorized persons, as deter-  
10 mined by regulations established by the registrar of motor  
11 vehicles, may change or adjust it. Vehicles used by any fire  
12 department or police department of the commonwealth shall  
13 be exempt from the restrictions imposed by this section along  
14 with such other vehicles as he deems necessary to be exempt.  
15 The registrar shall establish such additional rules and regula-  
16 tions as he deems necessary for the enforcement of this  
17 section.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January first,  
2 nineteen hundred and seventy-five.
