

commission if he ceases to be a resident of such district. No more than two such associate members shall at the same time be residents of the same district. Any vacancy in the office of associate member shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chap. 298.** AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN CORRECTIVE CHANGES IN THE OLD KING'S HIGHWAY REGIONAL HISTORIC DISTRICT.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 470 of the acts of 1973 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 23, the words "route 3" and inserting in place thereof the words: — route 6.

SECTION 2. Section 9 of said chapter 470 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "the", in line 25, the words: — applicant, the.

**Chap. 299.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF CERTAIN LAND FROM THE PORTUGUESE CEMETERY OF OUR LADY OF THE LIGHT TO THE ROMAN CATHOLIC BISHOP OF FALL RIVER.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. The Portuguese Cemetery of Our Lady of the Light, incorporated under the provisions of chapter seventy-eight and chapter one hundred and twenty-three of the revised laws of the commonwealth on April fourteenth, nineteen hundred and ten, is hereby authorized to transfer all its right, title and interest to any and all land held in the city of Fall River to the Roman Catholic Bishop of Fall River, a corporation sole.

SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act the incorporators of the Portuguese Cemetery of Our Lady of the Light shall be Joseph A. Faria and Richard H. Silva of the town of Swansea and Gilbert C. Oliveira, Paul F. Silva and Manuel Barboza, Jr. of the city of Fall River.

The powers of said incorporators shall be limited to electing officers and directors from the members of the incorporators, notifying all interested parties of their intention to transfer and, after a meeting called specifically for the purpose of voting the transfer of the land to the said Roman Catholic Bishop of Fall River, executing a deed conveying all of the right, title and interest in the land, including the license granted by the board of aldermen in the city of Fall River, adopted on September fif-
