## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Three.

AN ACT PROVIDING PERSONAL EXEMPTION OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR ALL PERSONS RETIRED OR SEPARATED FROM THE ARMED SERVICES OF THE UNITED STATES RECEIVING A PENSION, RETAINER, ANNUITY OR RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 8 of chapter 62 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after paragraph (m) the following para-

- 4 (n) Two thousand dollars of any pension, annuity or retire-
- 5 ment allowance paid by the United States government to a

THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE LAND OFFICE

REPORT FOR THE SENATE ON THE LAND OFFICE

1. The Commission on the Land Office was organized on January 1, 1933, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 100 of the Laws of 1932. Its purpose was to study the present and proposed methods of land management and to report thereon to the Senate.

2. The Commission has the honor to acknowledge the assistance and cooperation of the various departments of the State Government, particularly the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Conservation, and the Department of Public Safety.

3. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also conducted extensive research into the various aspects of land management.

4. The Commission believes that the present system of land management is in need of fundamental reform. It proposes a number of changes which it believes will result in a more efficient and economical system.
