

Chap. 306. AN ACT TO FURTHER REGULATE CERTAIN COMMON CARRIERS.*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Notwithstanding any provisions of chapter one hundred and fifty-nine A of the General Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, the department of public utilities may, with the approval of the mayor of the city of Boston, issue licenses for the operation of motor vehicles carrying passengers for hire to and from a major regional transportation terminal in the city of Boston and locations outside the city of Boston along the following public ways: all streets in the city of Boston between such terminal and the entrance and exit ramps of the Massachusetts Turnpike Extension, of the John F. Fitzgerald Highway, or of interstate highway Route 93 in the city of Boston, provided that such public ways are already in use by through, commercial passenger bus or truck traffic. Any license issued pursuant to this act shall stipulate that the licensee may receive or discharge passengers within the city of Boston for operations carried out under authority of such license only at one, specified, major regional transportation terminal.

*Approved June 9, 1975.***Chap. 307.** AN ACT REQUIRING THE PROMPT TRANSMISSION BY TREASURERS OF CITIES, TOWNS AND DISTRICTS OF DUES DEDUCTIONS FROM SALARIES OF TEACHERS TO CERTAIN TEACHERS' ASSOCIATIONS.*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 17C of chapter 180 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the third sentence, as appearing in chapter 175 of the acts of 1972, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence: — The treasurer of the city, town or district shall deduct from the salary of such teacher such amount of dues as may be certified to him on the payroll and transmit the sum so deducted to said association within thirty days of such deduction; provided, that the city, town or district treasurer is satisfied by such evidence as he may require that the treasurer of such association has given to said association a bond, in a form approved by the commissioner of corporations and taxation, for the faithful performance of his duties, in a sum and with such surety or sureties as are satisfactory to the city, town or district treasurer.

*Approved June 9, 1975.***Chap. 308.** AN ACT REVOKING THE PLYMOUTH-CARVER REGIONAL SCHOOL COMMITTEE'S ACCEPTANCE

OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAW RELATIVE TO THE
APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR LIFE AND HEALTH
INSURANCE FOR RETIRED TEACHERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the acceptance of section eleven E of chapter thirty-two B of the General Laws by the Plymouth-Carver Regional School Committee, the provisions of said section shall not be applicable to the Plymouth-Carver Regional School District.

Chap. 309. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HARWICH
TO RECEIVE AND ADMINISTER THE PROPERTY
OF THE HARWICH PORT CEMETERY ASSOCIA-
TION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The Harwich Port Cemetery Association, a corporation duly established under the laws of the commonwealth, hereinafter called the association, may, by deed duly executed, convey and transfer to the town of Harwich, and said town is hereby authorized and empowered to receive, and thereafter to hold and maintain, but for cemetery purposes only, and subject to all rights heretofore existing in any burial lots, the real and personal property of the association not subject to any trust, and, thereupon, and upon the transfer of the trust funds as hereinafter provided, the association shall be dissolved; and the cemetery of the association shall be and become a public burial place, ground or cemetery.

SECTION 2. Insofar as authorized by a decree of a court of competent jurisdiction and in compliance with the terms and conditions of such decree, said town may receive from the association a conveyance and transfer of, and administer, all funds or other property held by the association in trust for the perpetual care of the lots in the cemetery and for other purposes, and also any property devised or bequeathed to the association under the will of any person living at the time of said transfer or conveyance or under the will of any deceased person not then probated. Interest and dividends accruing on funds deposited in trust with any savings bank under authority of section twenty-five of chapter one hundred and sixty-eight of the General Laws, or with any other banking institution, for the benefit of the association, or any lots in the cemetery may, after such conveyance, be paid by such bank or institution to the treasurer of said town; and upon such payment said treasurer shall use the same for the purposes of said trusts.

SECTION 3. All real and personal property and property rights, acquired by said town from the association under authority of
