AN ACT RELATIVE TO REAL PROPERTY TAXATION EXEMPTIONS
FOR ELDERLY PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 59 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after clause Forty-first the fol-
3 lowing clause: —

4 Clause Forty-first A, Real property, subject to the same
5 qualifications and provisions of clause Forty-first, of persons
6 aged sixty-five to sixty-nine to the extent that would result in
7 abatements to the following percentages of the abatements
8 which persons aged seventy or older receive by the provisions
9 of said clause forty-first:

Aged 65	1/6
Aged 66	1/3
Aged 67	1/2
Aged 68	2/3
Aged 69	5/6

1 SECTION 2. The assessors of each city or town shall render
2 to the state treasurer annually an estimate of the tax revenues
3 lost through the application of this act, and the state treasurer
4 shall annually reimburse said cities and towns for said esti-
5 mated lost tax revenues.
