AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE DEVELOP PROGRAMS FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN PERSONS WHO ARE ILLITERATE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2A of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby
