AN ACT REQUIRING THE DISTRICT COURT OF HAMPSHIRE TO HOLD SESSION IN AMHERST.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the first paragraph under the caption
3 *Hampshire*, as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 The district court of Hampshire, held at Northampton and
6 Amherst, Cummington, Belchertown, South Hadley, Hunting-
7 ton and Easthampton; Hampshire county, except Ware, Enfield,
8 Greenwich and Prescott.
