2 learned with deep regret of the death of James R. McCarthy of
3 Greenfield; and

4 *Whereas*, James R. McCarthy was a well known and respected
5 member of the Personnel Board of the Town of Greenfield as
6 well as an active member and office holder in several labor
7 organizations in his district; and

8 *Whereas*, He was ever conscious of his obligations to the
9 people he represented and the positions he held and won the
10 admiration and respect of everyone with whom he came in
11 contact; and

12 *Whereas*, The passing of this public spirited citizen is an
13 irreparable loss to his Community and the Commonwealth; there-

16 hereby extends its regrets and deepest sympathy to the widow of
17 James R. McCarthy; and be it further
