AN ACT PERTAINING TO ON THE JOB TRAINING PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN VOCATIONAL SCHOOL STUDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, follows:

1 Section 3A of Chapter 142 of the General Laws, as inserted by
2 section 3 of Chapter 431 of the acts of 1963, is hereby amended
3 by adding the following paragraph: –

4 Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, stu-
5 dents under the direct personal supervision of a master or a
6 journeyman plumber who is certified as an instructor by the
7 Department of Occupational Education shall be permitted to en-
8 gage in an on-the-job training program, so-called, on installations
9 approved by the Board of State Examiners of Plumbers and con-
10 ducted in cooperation with a vocational school accredited by the
11 Department of Education.

12 The Board of State Examiners of Plumbers may formulate
13 rules and regulations relative to the above training program.
