AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE DISTRICT COURT OF CENTRAL BERKSHIRE AND THE DISTRICT COURT OF WILLIAMSTOWN EXERCISE CONCURRENT JURISDICTION IN THE TOWN OF HANCOCK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 218 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph under the
3 caption "Berkshire", as appearing in the Tercentenary Edition,
4 and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 The district court of central Berkshire, held at Pittsfield; Pitts-
6 field, Hancock, Lanesborough, Peru, Hinsdale, Dalton, Washing-
7 ton, Richmond, Lenox, Becket and Windsor; the district court of
8 Lee exercising concurrent jurisdiction in Lenox and Becket; the
9 fourth district court of Berkshire exercising concurrent jurisdic-
10 tion in Windsor and the district court of Williamstown exercising
11 concurrent jurisdiction in Hancock.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 1 of said chapter 218 is hereby
2 further amended by striking out the sixth paragraph under the
3 caption "Berkshire", as so appearing, and inserting in place there-
4 of the following paragraph: —

5 The district court of Williamstown, held at Williamstown,
6 Williamstown, New Ashford and Hancock; the district court of
7 central Berkshire exercising concurrent jurisdiction in Hancock.
