RESOLUTIONS CONGRATULATING THE STATE POLICE AND OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENTS FOR THE CAPTURE OF TWO FURLOUGHED INMATES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION AT WALPOLE.

1 *Whereas*, Due to the thorough, efficient and courageous work
2 of the Massachusetts state police and other police departments,
3 two inmates of the Massachusetts Correctional Institution at Wal-
4 pole, George W. Cermak and Joseph A. Subilosky, were recap-
5 tured after having escaped from the furlough program at Walpole;
6 and

7 *Whereas*, The investigation and subsequent apprehension of
8 these furloughed inmates demonstrated a positive example of
9 interagency cooperation and coordination; and

10 *Whereas*, The officers and members of the agencies concerned
11 were fully aware of the serious danger to themselves and to the
12 public; and

13 *Whereas*, They displayed a high degree of skill and determina-
14 tion in successfully apprehending and returning the escaped in-
15 mates; therefore be it

16 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
17 hereby commends most highly the following members of the

25 Wilson, Jr., Lieutenant Thomas Keating and Detective Irving
26 Tyler of the Chelsea police department; Captain George Hurley,
27 Sergeant Adam DePasquale and Detective Michael Casoli of the
28 Revere police department; Captain Donald M. Peters of the
29 Saugus police department; Agent Jack Williams and other mem-
30 bers of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and the members of
31 the New Hampshire state police who participated in the recap-
32 ture of the escaped inmates; and be it further
