Flaherty, Jr., for legislation relative to the initial appointment of commissioners of the Commission Against Discrimination; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1216) of Mario Umana and Charles F. Flaherty, Jr., for legislation to make certain changes in the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, and the procedures of said commission; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1692) of Francis C. Lapointe for the establishment of the position of director of campaign and political finances; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3652) of Thomas G. Simons for legislation to establish the office of director of campaign and political finance; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4423) of David J. Mofenson, Chester G. Atkins and Alan D. Sisitsky for legislation to prohibit the sale of lists of names which are on file in state agencies; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4800) of Robert J. McGinn and

Garreth J. Lynch relative to establishing a board of registration in psychiatry and psychiatric care; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5181) of Robert McGinn, Garreth J. Lynch and another that provision be made for the establishment of a diagnostic evaluation and treatment center for emphysema at the Western Massachusetts State Hospital in the city of Westfield; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6167) of Royal L. Bolling, Sr., for legislation to reorganize the structure of the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination and make certain changes in the procedures of said commission, report recommending that the accompany order (House, No. 7181) ought to be adopted.
