HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, August 20, 1973.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was recommitted the Bill increasing the amount of pensions and retirement allowances payable to certain former public employees (House, No. 3345); and to whom were referred the Bill relative to the balance of the unemployment compensation fund and the solvency account under the Employment Security Law (Senate, No. 216); the Bill providing that the Commonwealth shall pay the expenses of certain service provided to the town of Newbury by the armed forces of the Commonwealth (Senate, No. 1475); the Bill placing certain fire wardens in Group 4 of the contributory retirement law (printed as House, No. 154); the Bill to amend the 1972 accelerated highway bond issue to provide for certain federal aid (House, No. 248); the Bill to amend the authority of the Department of Public Works to cooperate with the United States of America (House, No. 249); the Bill broadening the authority authorizing cities and towns to appropriate and borrow money for solid waste disposal facilities (House, No. 292); the Bill establishing a scholarship and intern program in the Division of Forests and Parks (House, No. 661); the Bill authorizing the Commonwealth to contribute a sum of money to the federal government toward the cost and maintenance, if required, of a certain project in Scituate Harbor (House, No. 829); the Bill increasing reimbursable moving costs to owners of real estate taken by eminent domain (House, No. 1731); the Bill directing the Department of Public Works to acquire for the Commonwealth from the Boston and Maine Railroad the Washington Street Bridge in the city of Somerville, and upon such acquisition to reconstruct said bridge (House, No. 2411, changed); the Bill authorizing and directing the Department of Public Works to reconstruct substandard bridges, carrying Route #140 over the Penn Central Railroad, located in the towns of Franklin and Wrentham (House, No. 2611); the Bill to improve relocation assistance to federal standards (House, No. 4917, changed); the Bill requiring the Department of Public Welfare to contract with insurance carriers for the payment of Medicaid assistance (House, No. 5171);

the Bill to increase the whole estate which certain individuals may have to qualify for a real estate tax exemption (House, No. 6267); the Bill providing for the reconstruction of Whittenton dam on Mill River and the Morey Dam on Lake Sabbatia in the city of Taunton (House, No. 6635); the Bill providing creditable service for Mr. Louis J. Perrotta in the teachers' retirement system (House, No. 6927); the Bill relating to the reimbursement for loss of taxes on land used for certain state and county purposes (House, No. 7106); the Bill modifying the victims of violent crimes law (House, No. 7179); the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3203) of George R. Sprague that cities and towns be authorized to clear snow and ice from state highways in certain cases and providing for state reimbursement for expenses of such work; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4639) of James E. Smith relative to the erection of buildings to replace buildings taken by eminent domain for road construction which was not consummated; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6727) of William A. Connell, Jr., Robert B. Ambler and Allan R. McKinnon that the Commonwealth be required to reimburse the town of Weymouth for the cost of certain improvements and renovations to the municipal incinerator of said town; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 6737) of Ralph E. Sirianni, Jr., for the payment from the state treasury of a certain sum of money to Salvatore Petrone, report recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 7331) ought to be adopted.
