AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO RECONSTRUCT THE BRIDGE AT THE RIVERSIDE, TEMPLETON-GARDNER TOWN LINE.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide forthwith for the
3 reconstruction of the bridge at the Riverside, Templeton-Gardner
4 Town line, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law
5 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The Department of Public Works is hereby authorized and
2 directed to reconstruct the bridge at the Riverside,
3 Templeton-Gardner Town line and shall expend therefor such
4 funds as may be necessary.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or which may exist at the time of the first Meeting of the Congress, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, (including those bound to Service for a Year or more, and excluding Indians not taxed) three fifths of all other Persons.
