AN ACT CHANGING AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARY LINE BETWEEN THE TOWNS OF BEDFORD AND BILLERICA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The following described line shall hereafter be
2 in part the boundary line between the towns of Bedford and
3 Billerica: Beginning at a point on the existing boundary line be-
4 tween the towns of Bedford and Billerica, said point being
5 marked by a drill hole in a granite monument called Bedford-
6 Billerica-2 and having coordinates $x=669,946.07$, $y=553,858.00$;
7 and extending thence, following said boundary line S15-56-53E,
8 3114.28 feet to a point marked by a drill hole in a granite monu-
9 ment called Bedford-Billerica-1C and having coordinates
10 $x=670,801.77$, $y=560,863.58$; thence, leaving said boundary line,
11 S41-52-57E, 1366.44 Feet to a point marked by a drill hole in a
12 granite monument called Bedford-Billerica-1B and having coordi-
13 nates $x=671,714.01$, $y=549,846.25$; thence by a curve to the
14 right of 1353.38 feet radius, 425.96 feet to a point marked by a
15 drill hole in a granite monument called Bedford-Billerica-1A and
16 having coordinates $x=671,944.22$, $y=549,489.94$; thence
17 S23-50-57E, 535.78 feet to a point on the existing boundary line
18 between the towns of Bedford and Burlington, said point being
19 marked by a drill hole in a granite monument called Bedford-Bil-
20 lERICA-Burlington-1973 and having coordinates $x=672,160.85$,
21 $y=548,999.90$; thence following said boundary line N21-59-50E,
22 959.34 feet to the point of ending thereof on the existing bound-
23 ary line between the towns Bedford and Billerica, said point
24 being marked by a drill hole in a granite monument called Bed-
25 ford-Billerica-Burlington and having coordinates $x=672,520.19$,
26 $y=549,889.40$.

27 All said information pertaining to the changing and
28 establishing of the boundary line between the towns of Bedford
29 and Billerica is shown on a plan entitled "Town Line Relocation
30 Bedford-Billerica, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, dated

31 October 19, 1971” and prepared by Joseph W. Moore Co., Inc.,
32 Civil Engineers and Land Surveyors, 16 Railroad Avenue, Bed-
33 ford, Massachusetts.

1 SECTION 2. Coordinates used in this act are based on the
2 Massachusetts Coordinate System, Mainland Zone as described in
3 Sections 8 through 13, of Chapter 97 of the General Laws.
