AN ACT RELATIVE TO ELIMINATING RECIPROCITY ON RECREATIONAL AND SNOW VEHICLES OWNED BY NONRESIDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 30 of Chapter 90B of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out Section 30 as follows: —

3 In the absence of reciprocal usage agreements with other
4 states, a temporary permit may be issued for fifteen consecutive
5 days to out-of-state operators for a fee of two dollars; provided,
6 however, that a snow vehicle or recreation vehicle owned by a
7 nonresident which is duly registered in another state or country
8 may be operated within the commonwealth, without registration
9 by the director, if the director has determined that such other
10 state or country extends the same privilege to snow vehicles and
11 recreation vehicles registered in the commonwealth.
