

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 7751

Text of amendments adopted by the House to the Senate Bill relative to collective bargaining by public employees (Senate, No. 1929, amended).

1 Striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place  
2 thereof the following:

1 SECTION 1. Section one hundred and seventy-eight D and  
2 sections one hundred and seventy-eight F to one hundred and  
3 seventy-eight N, inclusive, of chapter 149 of the General Laws  
4 are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. The General Laws are hereby amended by  
2 inserting after chapter 150D the following chapter: —

3 *Chapter 150E.*

4 LABOR RELATIONS: PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

5 *Section 1.* The following words and phrases as used in this  
6 chapter shall have the following meaning unless the context  
7 clearly requires otherwise: —

8 “Commission”, the labor relations commission established  
9 under section nine O of chapter twenty-three.

10 “Cost items”, the provisions of a collective bargaining agree-  
11 ment which require an appropriation by a legislative body.

12 “Employee” or “public employee”, any person employed by a  
13 public employer except elected officials, appointed officials,  
14 members of any board or commission, representatives of any  
15 public employer, including the heads, directors and executive and  
16 administrative officers of departments and agencies of any public  
17 employer, and other managerial employees or confidential  
18 employees, and members of the militia or national guard and  
19 employees of the commission. Employees shall be designated as  
20 managerial employees only if they

21 (a) participate in formulating or determining policy, or

22 (b) are reasonably required, on behalf of a public employer, to  
23 assist directly in the preparation for or conduct of collective

RESOLUTIONS REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO ESTABLISH A CITIZENS ADVISORY PANEL TO THE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH ON THE USE AND DIRECTION OF THE THERAPEUTIC SCHOOL AT THE SITE OF THE CARDINAL CUSHING COLLEGE IN BROOKLINE.

1 *Whereas*, It is the enlightened public policy to involve  
2 communities and interested citizens in the programs of the  
3 Commonwealth; and

4 *Whereas*, The residents of Brookline as a whole and those  
5 residing adjacent to the Cardinal Cushing College have expressed  
6 an interest in the use of such property and mental health  
7 programs need community support and understanding; therefore  
8 be it

9 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives  
10 hereby requests that His Excellency the Governor create a  
11 Citizens Advisory Panel to provide advice to the Department of  
12 Mental Health regarding the proposed use, size and programs of  
13 the planned therapeutic school to be located on the site of  
14 Cardinal Cushing College; and be it further

15 *Resolved*, That the Citizens Advisory Panel should consist of  
16 five Brookline residents living adjacent to said ground, two  
17 residents of the Town at Large, two representatives from the  
18 Massachusetts Mental Health Center and the Mental Retardation  
19 Area Board, the Secretary of the Office for Administration and  
20 Finance and the Secretary of the Office of Human Affairs.
