HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, November 30, 1973.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were recommitted the Resolve in favor of Freda Salzman (duplicate of House, No. 3785); the Bill revising the General Laws relating to juveniles and establishing certain procedures for the juvenile courts (House, No. 7431); and to whom were referred the Bill providing that certain licenses heretofore or hereafter granted for placing and maintaining fill, piles and other structures over certain tide waters in the city of Boston shall be irrevocable, and for the release of other rights therein of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (printed as, Senate, No. 855); the Bill establishing a board of examiners of speech pathology and audiology (duplicate of Senate, No. 1884); the Bill requiring federal revenue sharing funds received by the Commonwealth to be used solely for General Fund debt service (House, No. 4136); the Bill authorizing cities and towns to borrow money for establishing, purchasing, extending or enlarging municipal gas and electric plants (House, No. 4722); the Bill authorizing the establishment of interlocal power authorities (House, No. 5097); the Bill providing for real estate tax exemptions for certain elderly persons (House, No. 7142); and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4131) of Kenneth P. O'Donnell and John A. Businger relative to pre-primary nominating conventions of political parties and providing for a primary election to be held on a Sunday in May to choose party nominees, report recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 7890) ought to be adopted.
