AN ACT PROVIDING FOR LIFE TENURE FOR HERBERT J. JASON, THE CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE TOWN OF YARMOUTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The tenure of office of Herbert J. Jason, incum-
2 bent of the office of chief of police of the town of Yarmouth,
3 shall, upon the effective date of this act, be unlimited. Said
4 incumbent shall not be removed from office, lowered in rank or
5 suspended, except for just cause and in the manner provided by
6 section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to
2 the voters of said town at the annual town meeting in the cur-
3 rent year in the form of the following question, which shall be
4 placed upon the official ballot to be used for the election of town
5 officers at said meeting: — “Shall an act passed by the general
6 court in the current year, entitled ‘An Act providing for life
7 tenure for Herbert J. Jason, the chief of police of the town of
8 Yarmouth’, be accepted?” If a majority of the votes in answer
9 to said question is in the affirmative, this act shall take full
10 effect, but not otherwise.
